Subject: Application for Library Intern Grant



Summary: The Oregon State Library announced a teen internship grant for up to \$5,000 and the application was due March 1, 2023. The position would work in the Cornelius library from June 1 through August 31, 2023.

Previous Council Action: The Library was granted permission to apply in 2022 and the Library was awarded \$3,072 for one teen (ages 16-19) intern that quite successfully completed the intended goals of the project.

Background: The State Library of Oregon is offering small grants to libraries in Oregon to fund library internships for local high school juniors or seniors (approximately 16–19 years old), to be completed in Summer 2023, up to \$5,000. This project was inspired by Public Library Association (PLA)'s Inclusive Internship Initiative and has been adapted for Oregon library needs. It is being funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) monies, awarded to the State Library from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) through the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA).

Financial Implications: The grant requires no match. It funds the wages, totaling \$3,499, for one teen intern from June 1 through August 31, for a total of approximately 192 hours at a rate of \$16.77 per hour + fringe benefits. If the Library is not selected for the award, the project will not be advanced.

Advisory Committee Recommendation: This grant does not require review by the Library Advisory Board. It will be described to that Board during a future meeting.

Staff Recommendation: Approve grant application as presented by staff through the consent agenda.

Proposed Motion: Consent Agenda.

I make a motion that the Cornelius City Council authorize the City Manager to approve the Library Intern grant application to the State Library of Oregon through the LSTA grant fund and this action takes effect immediately.

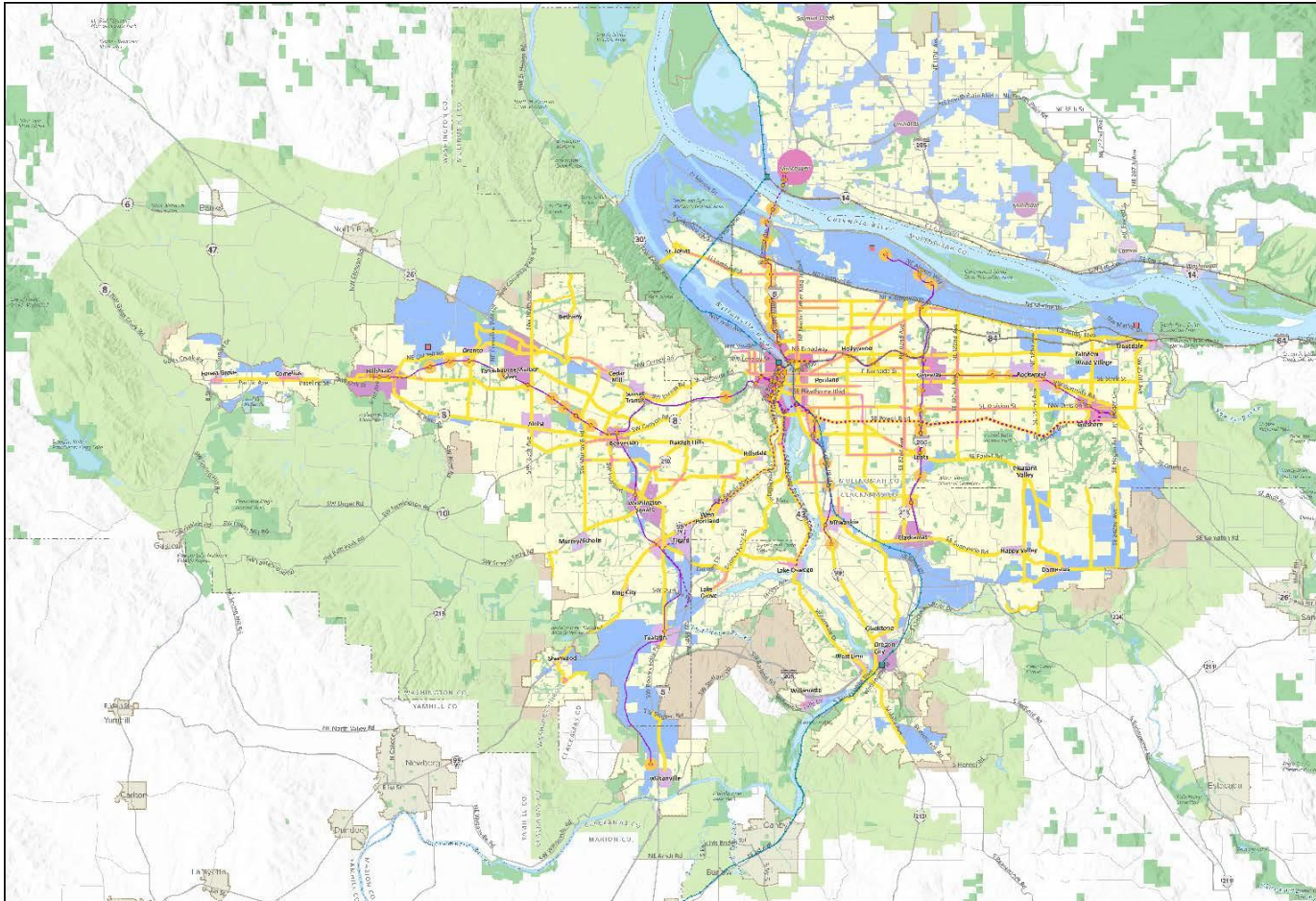

2040 Growth Concept Map December 2018

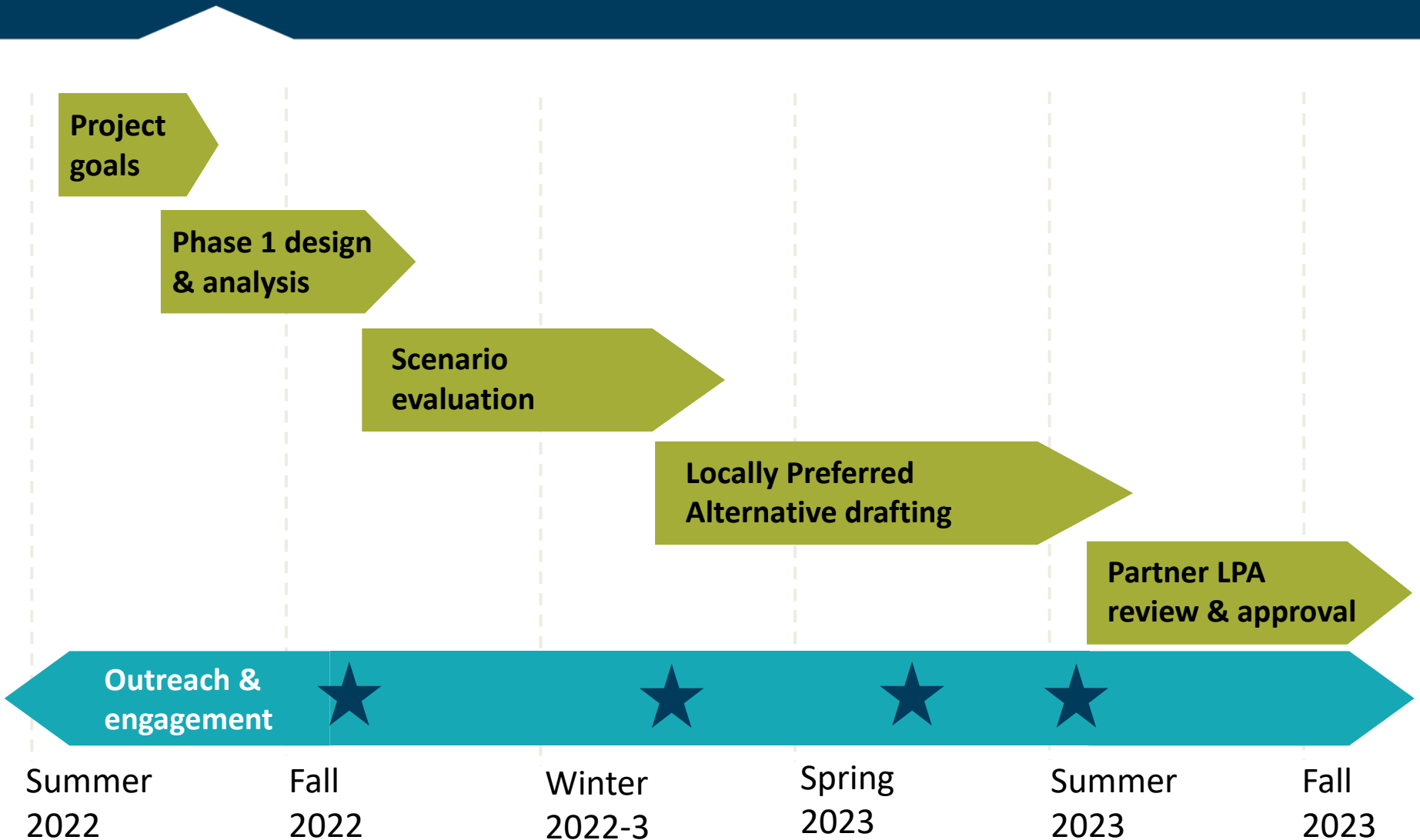

Summary: This resolution adopts a prioritized list of transportation projects in Cornelius for inclusion in the latest Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).
