Library Activities

Youth Services

- Youth Services Librarian Maria Aguilar attended Literacy Night at Cornelius Elementary. Maria presented information about the library to parents and kids at the event.
- Maria and Lisa (volunteer) were not awarded the REFORMA grant for books to giveaway at Children's Day this year. However, Lisa was able to secure a \$700 grant from the Oregon Community Fund!
- Maria will be partnering with All Together Now, a non-profit, to distribute a free book to each participant at our Children's Day Celebration on April 28.
- Maria was awarded the LSTA teen grant for a second year in a row! A local teen will be hired to support with summer reading and other library activities beginning June 1.
- Maria will be working with a remote MLS student intern to support youth programming as a result of the GLAM participation in the previous month.

Adult Services

- The quilting group that comes in every month "agrees that the library is a wonderful place to sew!". Quilting Friends is a program that is held every third Saturday of the month from 10:00am – 2:00pm. Anyone who is interested in meeting or brainstorming projects with other quilters is welcome to join!
- Two Interns were hired to work on an online internship to support Youth Services and Publicity Services. The intern is from San Jose State University, and the second is from the University of Kentucky, both studying their MLS.

Public Services

- The library collaborated with the Oregon Human Development Corporation (OHDC) to collect Long-Sleeve Shirt for our local farmers to help protect farmworkers from pesticide exposure and heat-related illnesses.
- Starting November 2022, the library started implementing a customer service survey to establish a baseline for customer satisfaction. We've had 10 patrons submit on how we can improve our library. With the highest rating of a score of 4. We had 8 patrons submit a score of 4. Below are a few comments.

Outreach

- The Trail Blazers are partnering with Cornelius Public Library for the Summer Reading Program. They will be providing 750 basketball game tickets for teen and kids that complete the Summer Reading Program!
- The Hillsboro Hops are partnering with Cornelius Public Library for the Summer Reading Program. They will be providing a filming and editing crew to help create a promotional video for the Summer Reading Program. They will be stopping by in April to film in the library with Barley, Hillsboro Hops staff and Library staff. They will be making an English and Spanish promotional Summer Reading video.
- David Freas, Outreach Librarian, and Itzel Andrade, Outreach Coordinator, are working with new intern, Hannah from San Jose State University. Hannah will create and design a Library Outreach and Publicity page on the city web page. This is the first time Publicity take on an intern that is completely online.
- David Freas and Itzel Andrade met DHS staff to form a partnership between the library and their Hillsboro office. The Hillsboro DHS offices serves families that are in Cornelius, Forest Grove, and Hillsboro area. The library will be working on multiple projects with the DHS staff in the near future.
- Itzel attended FGSD Finding A Sense of Belonging Family Summit at Neil Armstrong middle school. Itzel presented information about teen programs and volunteering opportunities to teens and parents attending the event.
- David attended an after-school program at Cornelius Elementary School. With the help of a volunteer, fun STEM activities were provided to over 35 kids in the program.
