# **Library Activities**

#### **Youth Services**

- Maria Agular (with the support of staff and volunteers) hosted a Children's Day Celebration in the library as part of the Friday Family Fun Night. Close to 100 kids, teens, and adults participated in the event. More than 50 books were handed out to kids.
- The library had its first indoor egg scavenger hunt! Over 600 eggs were hidden and found by kids, teens, and adults!
- Movers & Shakers, and Spanish story time participation has steadily been increasing this month.
- Pete the Cat scavenger hunt had over 150 participants and is highly sought by patrons each week.

# **Public Services**

#### Volunteers

- Volunteer Appreciation Week was April 16 22. A volunteer Appreciation Event was held in the Walters Community Room on April 16. There were 17 volunteers and their families that attended.
- In 2022, volunteers contributed over 4,107 hours to the library! That is equivalent to 2 full time staff members working.

#### **Outreach**

- The library interacted with 1,370 patrons at programs and outreach events in April.
- The library presented to 76 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students from Cornelius Elementary School for Career Day.
- The library's bookmobile joined Centro Cultural's El Día de los Niños program offering crafts and games to over 570 children and teens.

  space that will also serve as a makerspace!
