WCCLS Activities

- Library leaders will form a subcommittee to write-up desired qualifications for a consultant to research and advise the county on if, and how, to change funding allocations and governance. The consultant is schedule to begin January 2024.
- Five Oaks Museum (formerly Washington Co. Museum) has reopened and was added back onto the list of locations that patrons may visit for free using the WCCLS Adventure Pass program.
- WCCLS had a record-breaking 251,327 e-book checkouts in July. That is a 9% increase over June 2023 and a 21% increase over July 2022.

Library Activities

Youth Services

- Thanks to our new bookmobile and active Outreach Team, Summer Reading sign-ups have exploded! Over 1,500 youth have signed up that's a 25% increase over last year.
- Maria, Youth Librarian, and David, Outreach Librarian hosted three teen events with 48 attendees in the library in July.
- July bilingual storytimes were very successful. 38 kids and 25 adults attended!

Outreach

- Over 1,000 books were distributed at bookmobile events in July.
- The library helped make over 300 tie-dye t-shirts with campers at Adelante Mujeres Chicas camps and Centro Cultural's STEAM Camp.
- David attended a meeting of the Migrant Farm Workers Alliance.
 We'll provide more outreach services to migrant farm worker communities in August.
- The Outreach Team had a total of 885 interactions at bookmobile events, including at the Cornelius Farmer's Market.

Public Services

- A new Public Services Team started meeting weekly to discuss customer service, striving for improvements, consistency and safety.
- Patron Comments and Staff Interactions:

"Your library is number one!" - Patron

Administration

- Karen Hill, Library Director, is working with staff to update policies. The first one on the list it the patron behavior policy.
- The Drake Learning Center and Culturally Responsive STEM Lab project is moving ahead. The design and floorplan are complete and permits have been submitted to the City and County. Next comes the bidding process.
- The Library is still seeking volunteer for an art subcommittee to help us select and schedule artists to exhibit in the gallery.
- We have once again received Pacific University students to work all year in the library. Pacific pays the students and we assign them to various positions like technology, processing, and outreach support.
