- WCCLS partnered with member libraries to give away more than 13,000 books in 8 languages over the summer. This is part of their annual Countywide Book Distribution.
- Almost 8,000 new WCCLS Student Library Cards were created for students in Beaverton School District, Hillsboro School District, and Tigard Tualatin School District this week.

Library Activities

Youth Services

- The Toddler Program continues to be well received and attended. The Halloween Movers & Shakers program had 19 kids!
- A Spooky Dance Party for all ages was hosted at the library.
- Maria Aguilar and Angelica Novoa de Cordeiro hosted two Hispanic Heritage events with Centro Cultural
 that were very well received. There was a Hispanic author and illustrator panel where we had a script
 writer, a graphic novel artist, a YA author, an upcoming children's author and illustrator, and a poetry
 author. We wrapped up Hispanic Heritage month with live music by Romance and had pan dulce with
 coffee or hot chocolate!

Public Services

- Fernando Martinez, Public Service Coordinator, drafted an updated the Damage Procedures for damaged library items. The updated procedures will align with other WCCLS libraries to remove patron barriers and provide more positive customer service interactions.
- Opening and Closing procedures for the library building have been updated and implemented at the front desk.
- The library collected 192 patron satisfaction surveys between Sept. 1 Oct. 31. Survey responses are still being entered into the system, but so far there has been an average rating of 4.89 out of 5. Customer service and the library environment (cleanliness, spaces, etc.) were the reasons most mentioned by patrons for the high scores.
- Patron Comments and Staff Interactions:

Le Guin's Catwings, where the Spanish speaking dad could read the Spanish to the kids and then the older kid could help the dad learn English with the English copy.
